ABSTRACT

Through the use of the descriptive method of study, the researchers aimed to investigate the problems and positive and negative attitudes towards work and studies of working students ages 17 to 25 currently employed at 3 McDonald's branches around Metro Manila, namely those of United Nations Avenue, Morayta, and Harrison Flaza. Questionnaires were distributed to 60 randomly selected subjects (31 males and 29 females). To interpret results gathered from the questionnaires, the researchers subjected the attitude scores to the Regression Analysis using the .05 level of significance. It was revealed that both males and females have no significant difference in their attitudes towards work as well as towards studies. Also shown by the study, working students of higher levels in college have a more negative attitude towards work than those of lower years; the same can be said with regards to their attitudes towards studies. working students of different socio-economic status have no significant difference in their attitudes towards work studies.
