

ABSTRACT

This study investigated the performance of the De La Salle Student Council. It specifically sought to answer the following questions:

- 1) To What extent does the Student Council meet the expectations of the students?
- 2) To what extent does the Student Council meet its own objectives?

For the first problem, the Survey Method was employed through the use of a 15-item check-list constructed by the researchers. A total of 782 students, obtained through stratified random sampling, were the respondents for this study.

For the second problem, the researchers formulated indicators for each of the objectives of the Student Council. Data were obtained through Archival Research.

Results for the first problem showed that the Student Council is not able to meet the expectations of the students. This conclusion was arrived at after conducting a T-test, to determine if there is a significant difference between the expectations of the students and the perceived fulfillment of these expectations by the Student Council. Results for the second problem showed that the Student Council is able to meet its objectives only to some extent.
