#### ABSIRACI

This exploratory research to identify the different types of human relationships as perceived by a selected group of Manila college students, and the factors leading to these relationships. The interview method was used on 40 students. Results showed seven types of relationships: heterosexuality; (2) homosexuality; mutualism; (4) friendship; (5) platonic; (6) bisexuality; and (7) May-December Affair. The common factor leading to these relationships the members' need for a sense belongingness. It was concluded that different types of relationships commonalities in terms of: (1) social involvement; (2) time allotment; (3) language used: (4) level of commitment and other related dimensions. Differences amond relations were also discussed.
