

ABSTRACT

Subjects were exposed to 12 logic questions and were tested to see if negative nature syllogisms had an effect in performance score. Questions consisted of 2 kinds, one negative in nature and the other positive in nature. Subjects responded by indicating whether arguments were valid or invalid. Performance in correct mean score were then compared. Both mean incorrect score of positive and negative nature showed that there is an effect although the effect in behavior did not occur in the negative direction. It shows it was more on the side of having more correct answers.
