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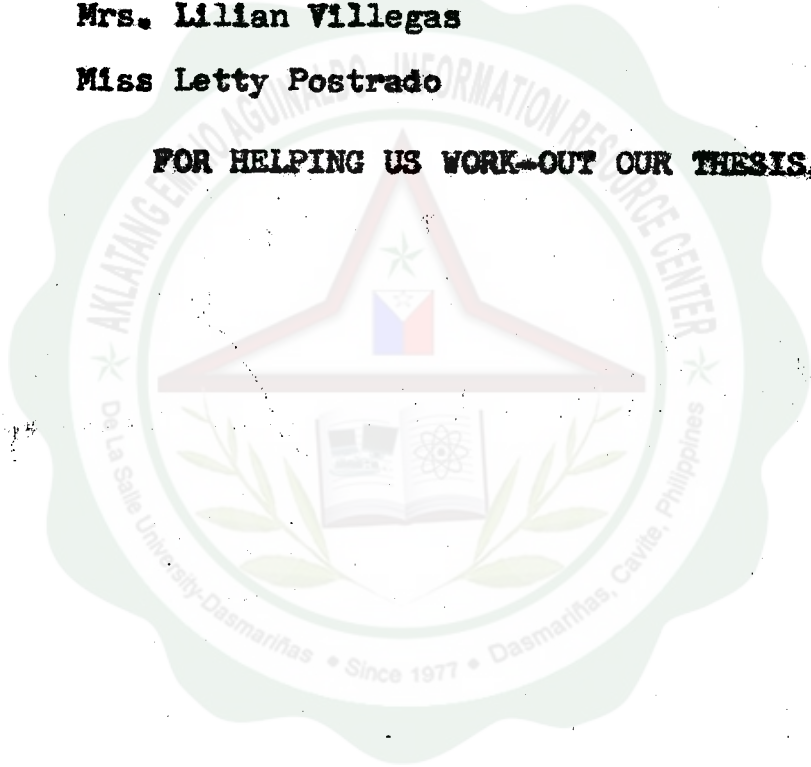
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CHAPTER V

Conclusions and Recommendations

The researchers have concluded from the data and results obtained, that there is a significant difference in attitudes towards gambling between male gamblers and female gamblers. In connection, male gamblers were inclined to show more favorability towards gambling than female gamblers. It was also established (under conditions of the present experiment) that there was no significant influence on attitudes towards gambling by the factors, namely; (1) financial capability; (2) educational attainment; (3) age groups. The results presented no significant difference in attitudes under these conditions.

Although results have been established to be factual under the present experiment's conditions, several improvements could be added as control for accuracy in scope and objective. For instance the survey could be extended in content by including certain questions on personal opinion and viewpoint. And extend the survey to cover a "real" representative sample in order to attain generalization in the Phil setting.

It would also be helpful to add certain types of gambling found locally. But the types should be equal in the degree it is indulged in. The variables should also be increased, including the former variables in the present exp-



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eriment. This would at least control certain extraneous variables from affecting the conditions of the experiment.
