THE FILIPINO HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS' CONCEPT OF ACHIEVEMENT

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ABSTRACT

This study, The Filipino High School Seniors' Concept of Achievement, intended to answer the three questions in the statement of the problem, namely: 1. What is the Filipino High School concept of achievement? 2. Is a person's concept of achievement related to his/her need of achievement? 3. Is the concept of achievement related to sex? Furthermore, the study used exploratory as its research design and consisted of 246 selectively chosen respondents, 127 males from San Sebastian College and 119 females from St. Paul's College. There were two instruments used, namely: a self-constructed questionnaire, for measuring concept of achievement and the EPPS, for measuring need for achievement. Some statistical tools were used such as frequency distribution, percentages and Chi-square. The results or findings of this research can be briefly stated in the following manner: 1. The Filipino High School concept of achievement is fulfilling a set of goals. 2. There is a significant relationship between concept and need of achievement. 3. There is no relationship found between concept of achievement and sex.



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
