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ABSTRACT

A study which intends to look into certain factors which are associated with the occupational choices of graduating female students in an urban setting, was conducted using a select group of female graduating students from the Inter-Institutional Consortium Schools, namely: De La Salle University, St. Scholastica's College, St. Paul's College, Philippine Normal College and Philippine Christian University. There was a total count of four hundred sixty-six respondents. The study made use of secondary data from the Integrated Redearch Center of DESU gathered in December 1980 by the use of a self-administered type of questionnaire consisting of open-ended and structured questions. It was found out that there was a significant relationship between residence of parents and occupational choce; between school attended and occupational choice; between socio-economic status and occupational choice; between parental occupational aspirations and the student's own occupational choice; and between parental encouragement to go abroad and occupational choice.
