OBJECTIVES OF THE STUDY

A. General

To determine the compelled needs of the respondents affecting their engaging to suicidal thoughts and its implication to social functioning.

B. Specific

- 1.) To identify the compelled needs affecting the engagement to suicidal ideation of gays;
- 2.) To describe the gays' demographic profile as a significant factor affecting their compelled needs;
- 3.) To conduct a useful program that would prevent not just gay people but also all the students from engaging in suicidal ideation or suicidal attempt.

Scope and Coverage

The main concern of this study is to identify the compelled needs affecting the engagement in suicidal ideation and conducting a useful program that would make all the concerned students be aware about the hazards of engaging into suicidal ideation or worse committing suicide.

This study is limited to 30 respondents who came from different colleges of De La Salle University. Some of them were referred by the researchers' friends and acquaintances.

Findings would only be taken from the eight respondents' answered Suicide Potential Inventory for Filipinos Questionnaire and their demographic profile regarding the issue of suicidal ideation.
