ABSTRACT

This study, which revolved around the design of instructional materials for vocabulary skills development, was conducted in order to meet the vocabulary needs of students at the Widya Mandira Catholic University. It sought to establish and to answer the following questions:

- 1. What model should be adopted for the materials design on vocabulary skills development?
- 2. What type of materials should be designed to meet the vocabulary needs of the sophomore students majoring in English?
- 3. What approaches should be considered in terms of the following skills for vocabulary development:
 - a. lexical (dictionary),
 - b. contextual clues,
 - c. structural analysis.

Books and unpublished theses that emphasize their discussions on vocabulary skills development, and the teaching of vocabulary were used as sources for this study.

The materials that were designed covered sixteen lessons intended to be taught for one semester. These
