



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ABSTRACT

The existing CAP Scholarship Servicing System is presently utilized by the College Assurance Plan Company in making transactions with fully paid educational scholars. This computerized system handles report generation and record keeping of all scholar availments. However like other system, it has loopholes. We must realize that in every organization, loopholes are problems and obstacles towards organizational success.

The proponents of the study interviewed the actual users of the existing system from the Contract Benefits Administration about the abilities and inabilities of the existing system and took notes of the information gathered. Among the loopholes that were most identified were the inability of the system to update its records on per transaction basis, the lack of the school query module, and the lack of a module for the computation of fees.

These loopholes were studied and solved by the proponents by using the Spiral Methodology to make an updated version of the existing system. The significant features of the existing system and the corrective abilities for the loopholes are covered for the benefit of the client and the company itself. 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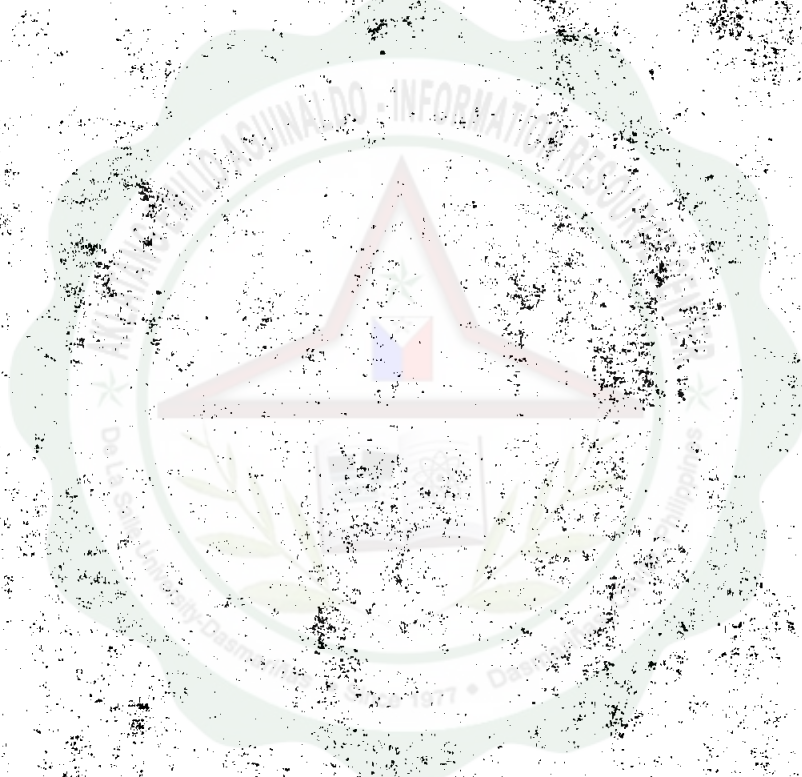
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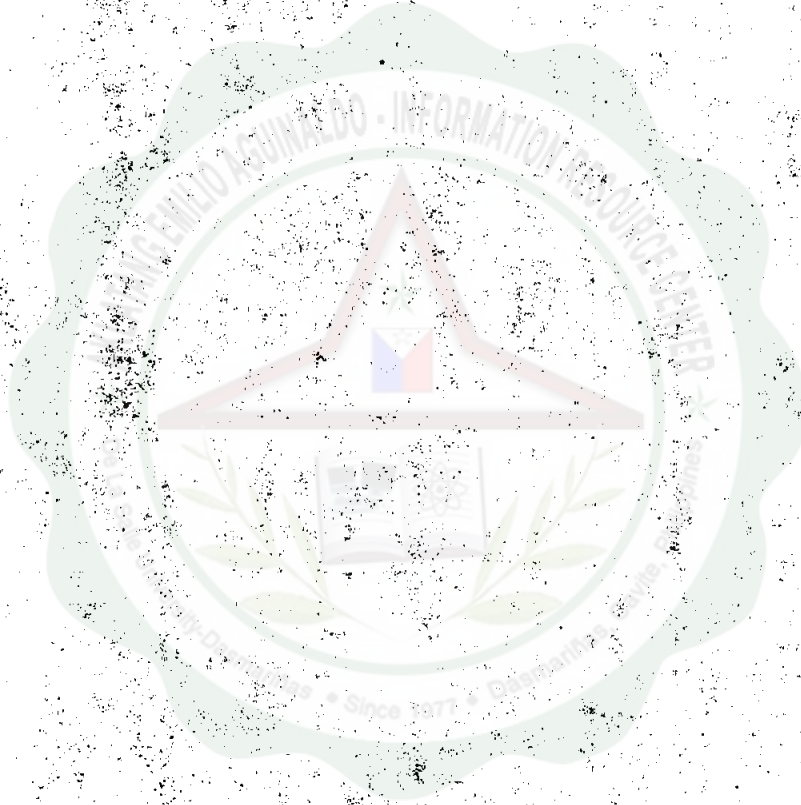
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
