

## **Thesis Abstract**

This research is entitled, Perceived Impact of Field Training Program of the Philippine National Police. The research is qualitative, having four respondents - male non-commissioned officers. The research focused on the impact of the field training program of the PNP.

The researchers used qualitative research. According to Bryman (2008), qualitative research is a research strategy that usually emphasizes words rather than quantification in the collection and analysis of data. The study found that there are different effects, difficulties, impact, and advantages that can be attained and acquired in the field training program of the PNP.

The researchers present the following recommendations. (1) Each field training officer must also evaluate the place and would-be-companions of the police trainees. (2) The PNP should enhance the monitoring of trainees during their field deployment to avoid being influenced by dirty cops. (3) In the evaluation of the trainee after the field deployment, if the trainee has a low evaluation points, the police officer who is with that trainee during his deployment must face the board for investigation and evaluation.
