



ABSTRACT

Adolescence and young adulthood are the stages wherein a young individual undergoes mental and physical changes and such changes causes awareness and curiosity in one's body. These curiosities combined with pressure from peer groups usually results to teenagers and young adults engaging in sexual activities. This study aims to determine (1) the sexual behavior of college students in DLSU-D (2) the relationship between intelligence quotient and sexual behavior and (3) the relationship between emotional intelligence and sexual behavior. Two hundred ten (210) college students in DLSU-D were assessed through three tests which would measure their intelligence quotient, emotional intelligence and sexual behavior. It is notable that the sexual behavior of the respondents ranges from slightly participative in sexual activities and moderately participative in sexual activities. These results indicate that there is no significant relationship between intelligence quotient and sexual behavior, similarly, there is also no significant relationship between emotional intelligence and sexual behavior.
