



### ABSTRACT

This research explored the communication patterns of five OFW parents and their adolescent children based on their level of conversation as well as their level of conformity. This work relies on Family Communication Theory and Computer-Mediated Communication Theory to support the study. These two fundamental concepts contributed to the objective of finding the communication patterns and the type of family the participants belong to. The study provides five unique and extreme cases in the City of Dasmariñas, Cavite and used snowball sampling to find the appropriate participants. Participants in-depth interviews, along with IOWA Family Rating Scale for the assessment were used to collect the desired data. Based on the data that were gathered, the researchers found out that there are several factors affecting the levels of conversation and conformity for each participants such as frequency, duration and topics that are being discussed, time difference, the bond between parent and child.
