Stand on PT Students and Parents' complaints defined

The academic community of DLSU-EAC has the primary responsibility of setting its academic standards. But in so doing, it has and still is consulting the other sectors of the community.

This is the stand expressed by Dr. Oscar O. Bautista DLSU-EAC Executive Vice President in behalf of the College Deans and Assistant Deans together with the faculty regarding the complaints of some parents and some graduating students of the College of Physical Therapy.

It was also a part of a detailed reply to the First Endorsement about the complaints sent by Dr. Diosdado C. Boisier, Chief of Higher Education Division (DECS) Region IV.

The complaints reached the Office of the EVP for the first time through an unscheduled meeting on March 2, 1991. So that direct discussions can be done, a second dialogue was held on March 4, 1991. Present in this second dialogue were the EVP, the Dean and almost all faculty members of the College of Physical Therapy and a representative of the Parents Organization La Salle Cavite (POLCA).

Four issues were raised by the complaining parents and students. These were as follows:

1. The original criteria for computation of the final Internship Grade were changed by the Dean, as evidenced in her circular dated

February 20, 1991. As a result only 59 out of 174 students became qualified as candidates for graduation.

2. The system of Revalida I Examinations, both Written and Oral are invalid because only 9 students passed out of 174.

3. The faculty members lack the proper academic qualifications and teaching experiences.

4. There is weakness in the institutional procedure followed last year because if so many of the present 4th year student do not really deserve to pass, they should have been failed last year, when they were still in their third year.

Dr. Bautista then detailed the University's response to these four issues.

On the matter of changing the original criteria for computing the Internship Grade without adequate consultation:

1. It is not true that the original criteria herein referred to were changed. This original set of criteria was followed and it resulted in only

nine (9) students who qualified for graduation because only these 9 students passed Revalida I and at the same time, passed all other criteria, except the Hospital Affiliation Grade because such grades were not yet received from the various affiliated hospitals.

2. The faculty felt that more than 9 students deserve to become candidates for graduation, pending the Hospital Affiliation Grades. Thus, they deliberated and come up with a supplemental set of criteria whose purpose was to increase the number of candidates for graduation. This supplemental criteria appears as Appendix B.

With the use of this supplemental criteria, fifty (50) more students became eligible as candidates for graduation (pending results of the Hospital Affiliation Grades), raising the total to 59 students.

Also with the use of this supplemental criteria, another batch of 25 students will become eligible as candidates for graduation if they pass the Oral Examination Portion of

RT Board Passers

27 out of 36 Associate in Radiologic Technology graduates passed the Proficiency Examination for Medical Radiation Technician given by the Radiation Health Service in collaboration with the Civil Service Commission in Manila last May 27, 1991. DLSU-EAC's percentage passing is 75% compared to the national passing of 49%. Violeta placed 5th with a score of 91%. Two of DLSU-EAC's faculty members and two graduates also passed the Proficiency Examination for Medical Radiation Technologist, given on May 27, 1990. Susan Alcaraz topped it with a grade of 95%.

the Revalida II (or re-take of the failed Revalida I).

It can be seen, therefore, that the complaining parents and student wrongly perceived that the original set of criteria was changed and was done so to the detriment of the students. What actually happened was that another set of supplemental criteria was developed to enable

Secretary of the Year - Noralyn Generillo.

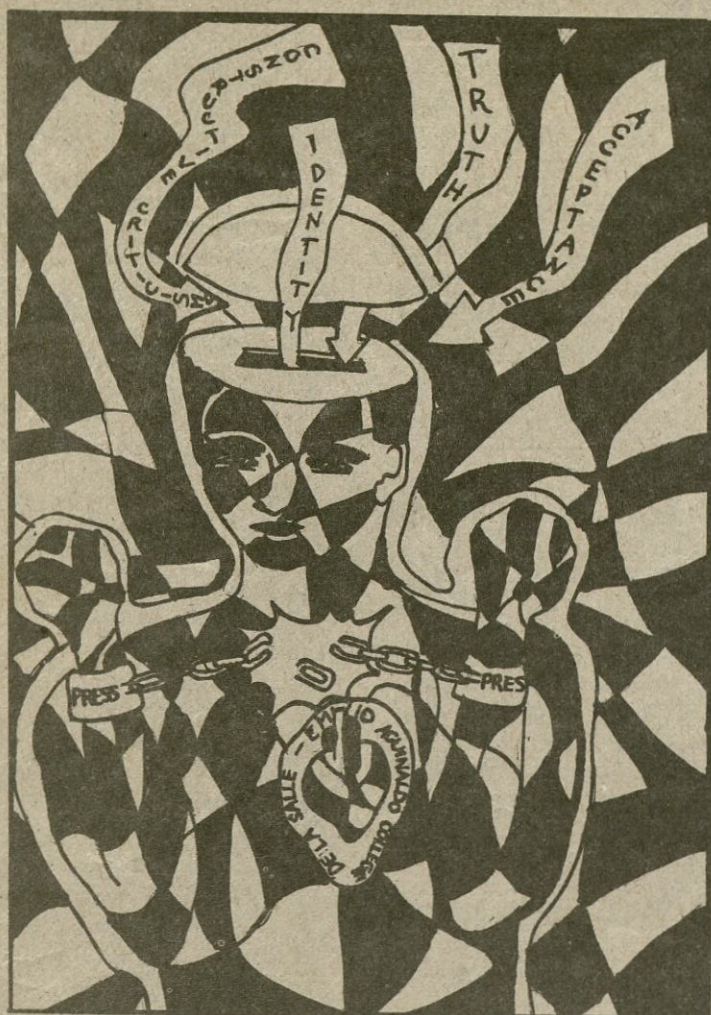

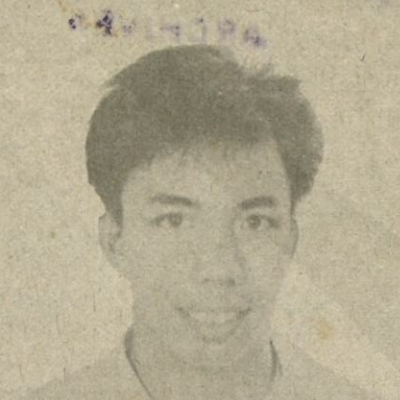
Editorial

The EDSA "Revolution" was celebrated for the fifth year last February 25. The celebration reminded us that many of the principles and values which the revolution stood for is still far from being a reality. We cannot afford a government of thieves unless we can tolerate a nation of highwaymen.

You will also recall that the thirst for justice was and remains the utmost desire of our people.

And he spoke of the EDSA revolution as a dream. And the dream must go on for EDSA was just the beginning . . .

. . . And the dream of a Filipino nation of freedom, of justice, of equal opportunity, of peace and brotherhood— must remain in our consciousness and conscience at all times, in all climes. True, it is a dream of the innocent. But it is also the dream of the brave and of the heroic. And we must all keep on dreaming because those who never dream no longer have hearts that beat or breath that inspires or faith that over-

Is this not a dream that brings us closer to the realization or the reality of the kingdom of God?

Chino Roces has reminded us in his lifetime that the thirst for justice was and remains the utmost desire of our people.

How could this thirst for justice be quenched? The answers to this question came when a lawyer asked Jesus Christ the question:

Master, what is the great commandment in the law?

Romans 13:8-10

If love is the fulfillment of the law, then every act of man, of every institution, and of every government must be directed towards loving God and loving one's neighbor.

For indeed if we love our neighbors, we will not rob them;

more students to pass. It is worthwhile to emphasize here that if there were no supplemental criteria developed and only the original criteria were followed, only nine (9) students would have qualified as candidates for graduation.

On the matter of invalidity of the system of Revalida Examinations, including the Written and Oral Examinations.

The Dean and faculty members of the College of Physical Therapy feel that the questions asked in both examinations consisted mostly of the basic knowledges and skills they feel should be possessed by graduating physical therapy students. As such, they do not agree that these examinations were invalid; on the contrary, they feel that they are valid, especially insofar as content validity is concerned.

They are willing to discuss the contents of both examinations with professionals in the field, to settle the issue of content validity.

Moreover, the system of Revalida Examinations has been an integral part of our screening system for 4th year PT students ever since I can remember. The Revalida Examination had been the most important component in the computation of final grades 2-3 years ago.

On the matter of the perceived "inadequacy" of faculty members - because majority of the faculty members were recent graduates of school year 1989-90 and did not have enough teaching experience.

The complaining parents claim that the College of Physical Therapy is not strictly following the rules and regulations of DECS insofar as the academic qualifications and teaching experiences of faculty members are concerned. This, in turn, is used as a basis for suggesting that the examinations given by these faculty members may not be valid.

While it is true that DECS specifies that teachers in the collegiate level should have masteral degrees, as much as possible, and should have adequate teaching experiences before hired to teach in college, this could not be followed in almost all Colleges of Physical Therapy in the Philippines. Almost all of the graduating students of every school year opt to go abroad rather

than teach; thus, the College of Physical Therapy, like many colleges of Physical Therapy in the Philippines, face this problem.

The University feels that even if the faculty are new graduates, they are not inadequate insofar as their duties as faculty members are concerned. Before they were allowed either to teach or become clinical supervisors, they were required to attend seminars in methods of teaching, required to act as informal assistant instructors when they were on the 4th year, as well as undergo preparatory training under the supervision of the Dean.

Moreover, all the faculty members, though newly graduates as of last school year, belong to the upper 10 percent of the graduating batch and have mostly passed the PT Board Examinations or waiting for such results.

The University assures the DECS the complaining parents and students, that it is trying its best to hire only the best faculty members under the circumstances.

On the suggestion that the College of Physical Therapy should fail students at the end of the third year rather than at the end of the 4th year.

It is not true that the college is not failing students at the end of the year, for it does fail them at this point in time.

The college had reasonable expectations that those who passed the third year would be able to pass the 4th year requirements.

Moreover, this is to correct the impression that if a 4th year student fails to graduate this coming April because of academic deficiencies, such student will be dismissed or "kick-out" of the College of Physical Therapy or of DLSU-EAC - this is not true, for such a student will be required only to repeat that subject or Revalida Examination and pass it, to be able to graduate at the succeeding term. (This will explain the case of irregular students being part of the regular batch of students).

If the suggestion is to be stricter in passing students at the end of the 3rd year, then, the college will certainly consider this for the coming school year.

To address these grievances, the institution offered to still use the original set of criteria for computation of the final Internship Grade (as these appear in the PHYSICAL THERAPY INTERNSHIP PROGRAM RULES AND REGULATIONS) and discard the use of the supplemental criteria for computation of internship grades, plus the following revisions:

Even if there is failure in one or more criteria, as long as the student reaches a total average of 70%, the student will become a candidate for graduation, except when he/she fails in the Hospital Affiliation Grade, in which case he/she will have to repeat such failed grade.

(Note: In the original set of criteria, a student becomes disqualified as a candidate for graduation if any one of the various criteria is failed).

The student who scores below 70% will be required to take another Revalida Examination, without the prior need for enrolling in a Refresher (Comprehensive) Course.

(Note: In the original set of criteria, a student cannot take Revalida III after failing Revalida II unless he/she has passed a prerequisite enrollment in a Refresher (Comprehensive) Course.

There will be no more dismissal (or "kick-out") from the College of Physical Therapy, even if a student failed Revalida, I, II or III. Any such kind of student will be allowed to take as many Revalida Examinations, without the prior need for enrolling in a Refresher (Comprehensive) Course.

Still, the complaining parents would not accept these revisions offered by the institution and insisted that "all students should pass and be allowed to graduate."

They qualified this stand, however: That those with some academic deficiencies, while being allowed to graduate, be required to sign a document stating that DLSU-EAC will not allow them to take the Physical Therapy Board Examinations if they have not previously taken a refresher course or a Review Seminar after graduation.

The institution cannot accept such proposal because the Faculty of the College of Physical Therapy, cannot, in conscience, pass students whom it feels should not pass because it would have gravely compromised its institutional academic standards and would, in consequence, also compromise our obligations to the academic standards of the profession of Physical Therapy.

Even, if only for the sake of argument, but without accepting, that the college passes and allows to graduate all fourth year students, the Institution would have no more legal hold on them after graduation.

The suggestion of requiring students to undergo a refresher course or a review seminar after graduation before allowing them to take the Physical Therapy Board Examination would not be legally defensible and would expose the Institution to further trouble.

Moreover, a student, once graduated from the Institution, may take the Board Examination even without undergoing any review course. This is his individual choice. The institution feels that the school cannot compel a student to take a review course, after graduation. The matter of taking a review course prior to the Board Examination is an individual decision.

No college or university compels its alumni as to when they may or may not take the Board Examination.

Some students may not take the Board Examinations and may find employment as physical therapist or allied health profession. For these students, it would now appear that the institution graduated ill-prepared students;

Some students may go abroad directly and find employment when they, in the first place, did not deserve to graduate. This kind of situation may compromise not only the standards of DLSU-EAC and of the Physical Therapy profession, but also of our country.

As of this writing, the institution intends to follow what were discussed to use the original criteria for computation of the Internship Grade with various revisions. The institution projects that with such kind of a formula for computation of grades, more than 100 students will finally become eligible as candidates for graduation, pending receipt of the Hospital Affiliation Grades.

Twenty to thirty students who will probably be judged as failing this school year will be required to retake the Revalida Examinations, until such time that they will finally pass such examinations.

This is the most that the institution can do to help the complaining parents and students. However, Dr. Diosdada C. Boisier was invited to come over to DLSU-EAC to discuss these issues with or without the complaining parents.

port Communism.

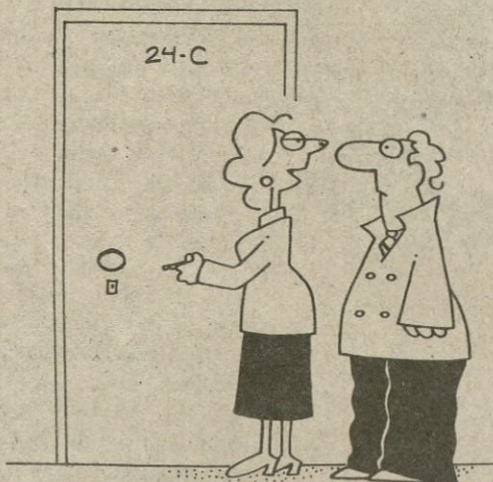

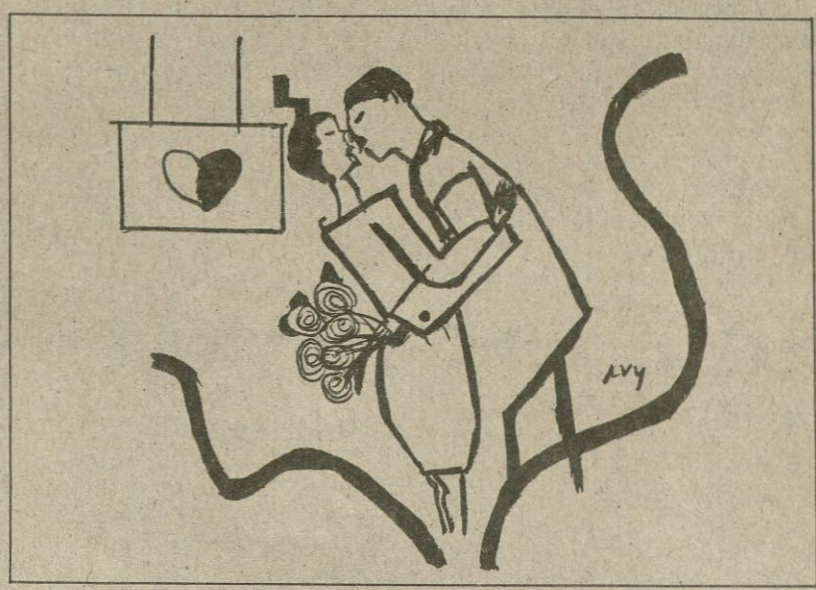

If in spite of them, you're still brimming with excess love, gain more friends, make peace with your enemies (have you hugged your pet

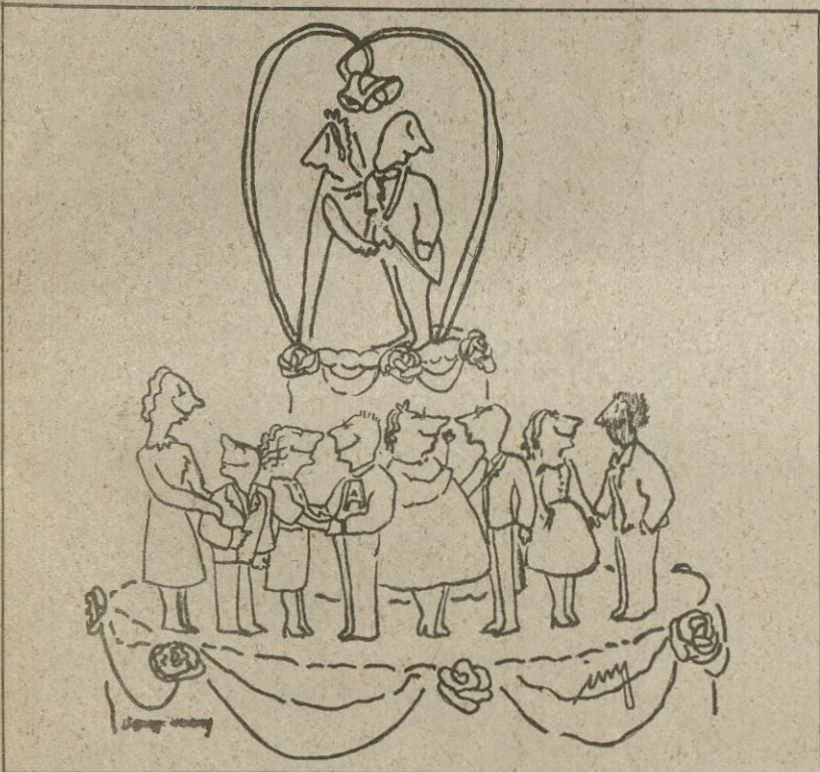
lately?); re-channel your emotions into something creative like a new hobby or an interest club.

NATURE AND INVENTION

In 1698, Thomas Savey invented the first Steam Engine. And in 1895, Wilhelm Roentgen discovered the X-Ray, which made a breakthrough in Photographing bone fractures. These are two of the inventions and findings that changed the path of our life. History tells us that there are some arguments on whether who was the first discoverer, or who must be given the credit for a certain invention.

A Biologist explains that we're not really the innovators. In fact we are only the repeaters. It is evident to say that many times, human inventors only repeat what plants and animals have been doing for thousands of years. As a proof consider the following examples...

In Air Conditioning, modern technology cools many homes. But before it, the termites also cooled theirs. But how? Their nest is in the center of a large mound, from it warm air arises into a network of air ducts near the surface. The stale air diffuses out the porous sides, and fresh cool air seeps in and descends into an air chamber at the bottom of the mound. From there it circulates into the nest. Some mounds have openings at the bottom where fresh air comes in, and in hot weather, water brought up from underground evaporates, thus cooling the air.

Thomas A. Edison is credited with inventing the light bulb. But it is not too efficient, as it loses energy in the form of heat. The fireflies do it better as they flash their lights on and off that loses no energy.

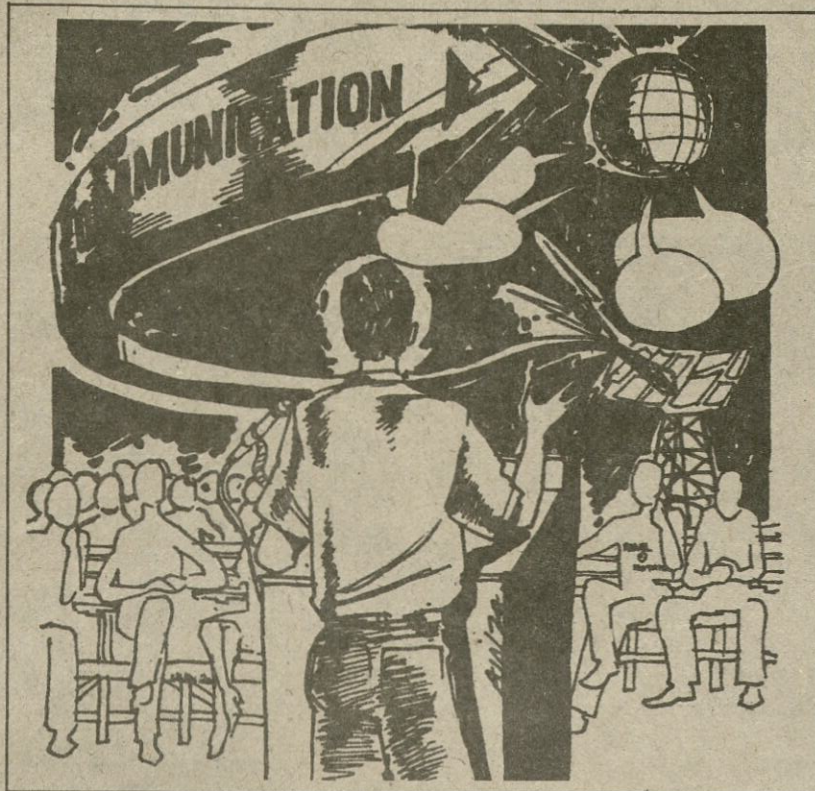

CMT Controversy

As early as the start of 2nd semester, I was already in formed of the ongoing controversy regarding varsity players excuses from their CMT. Actually it's a problem that can be solved within a day or two, but as I ignored it, it became a big talk.

The background of the issue are as follows: A meeting was held last June 13, 1990 (a week before the school year 1990-92 started) by Mrs. Laura Campos (Dean of Student Affairs), Ms. Selfa Napicol, Capt. Azucena (CMT head), Ms. Necitas Sayoto (P.E. Director) and Mr. T. Sayuno (Varsity Coordinator), and have agreed on some conditions with regards to varsity players and performing arts group and their exemptions and excuses. Here are the conditions:

1. A varsity or a performing arts will be exempted from CMT in case of a big activity such as ICUAA or Festival of Performing Arts and P.E.
2. In case of a non-important competition, they will be excused only especially when their practice or rehearsal falls on Sunday (in case of CMT) and when the need arises (in the case both CMT and P.E.).
3. The adviser of each group will write a letter to the person concerned through the recommendation of the Dean of Student Affairs. The letter must contain the names of the students to be excused/exempted.

The agreement was running smoothly as both parties really needed the said harmony, but Capt. Azucena was relieved as Head of the CMT and Capt. Olep was named as his successor. This new commandant did not honor the previous agreement. Varsity players dropped from their CMT classes while engaging in the ICCUAA (inter Cavite Collegiate University Athletic Association) tournaments. Incidentally, things became worse when PC was abolished and Capt. Olep was also relieved. Air Force takes over and Major Mojica entered as the new CMT ruler. By the time he came in, varsity players were

really complaining, especially those graduating and incoming interns, knowing that they can't meet the requirements in order for them to graduate.

I tried to see Mrs. Laura Campos to clarify things. It only happened that the administration had been very busy for some scheduled program. Incidentally, a meeting was set the day before I talked to her, to settle the issue.

On the said meeting, which was attended by EVP Oscar Bautista and others, concerned, it was agreed upon that graduating varsity players will be allowed to graduate in a condition insisted by Major Mojica that they must attend summer CMT classes. Special order from DECS will only be delayed for them as they haven't completed yet their requirements. For non-graduating varsity players, they are required to enroll summer CMT.

CMT exemption has always been the problem ever since the university decided to form school varsities. Is CMT exemption really needed? Is it the only privilege that a varsity can get? Can't this varsity players play without exemption?

CMT is required to all male students Violating this seems to be a direct way of cheating the DECS and dishonoring the law of Air Force. Why go for a irregularity if we have something favorable. I guess the administration should set some privileges that varsity players

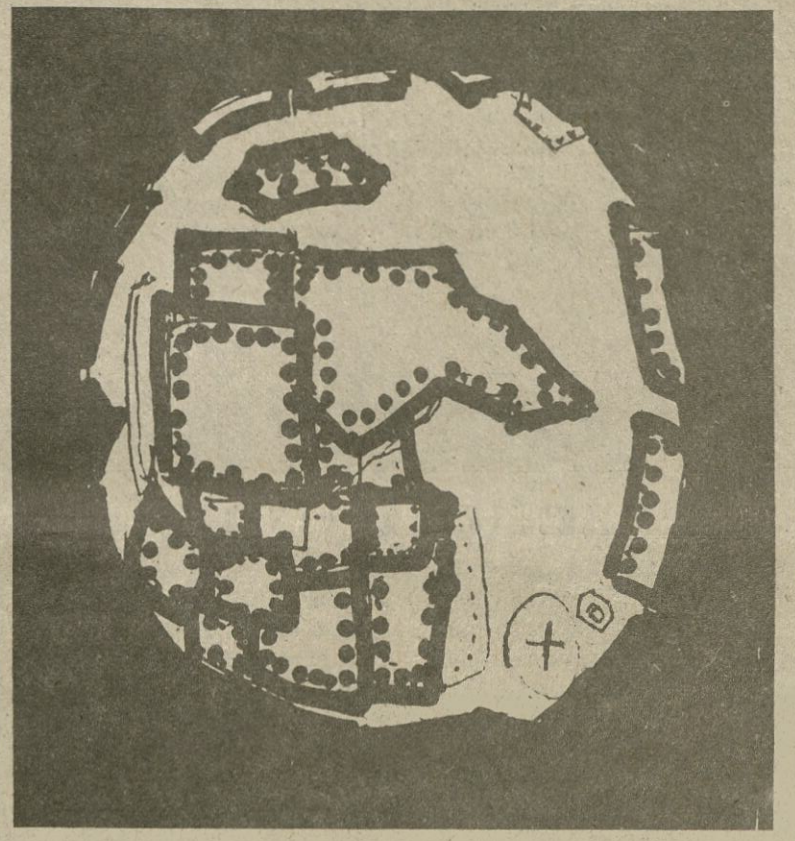

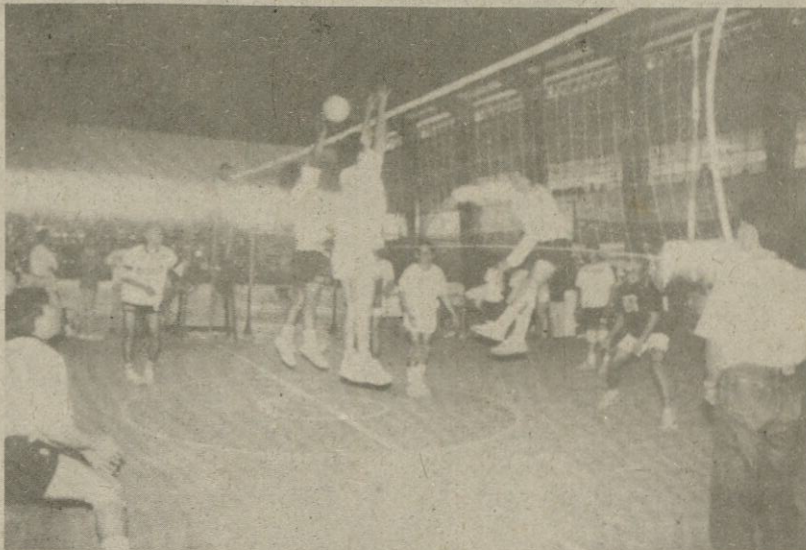

Practical Sport?

Is there a sport that provides an individual a proper mental and physical training at the same time teach him to be humble and courteous to others? This issue's TOPIC is all about my concept of a practical sport, the martial arts. Their value lies in the excellent recreation they provide, the level of physical fitness they achieve and a form of self defense they give should the need arise.

Not all martial arts are considered sports, only a few well devised and carefully studied art developed into sports. There are three major forms of martial arts recognized as sports, they are Karate, Judo and Taekwondo. Two of them, Judo and taekwondo are now enjoying olympic status.

Taekwondo— this is a form of Korean martial arts which emphasizes the use of the feet as attacking tools although it also uses hand techniques. Taekwondo, which was introduced in the Seoul olympic as a demonstration sport will now be recognized as a regular event in the 1992 Barcelona Olympics in Spain. To score points, individuals are allowed to hit the colored portion of the of his opponents armour and the head area.

Judo — This Japanese art which employs the use of throws, joint locks and choke holds was introduced in the 1964 Tokyo olympics.

Judo principles are based on harmony, using your opponents' strength against him. To win, the judoka must either throw his opponent cleanly or lock his elbow joint to submission. He can also choke his opponent to make him surrender by tapping the mat or the player himself. Observers of this sport often ask if it hurts when you get thrown. It does, but proper falling technique relieves the throw of most of its impact.

Karate— This form of Japanese martial art was developed mainly because the inhabitants of feudal Japan needed a form of protection against the samurais and the ruthless shoguns of the era. Contest points are scored by punches and kicks to the face and the body. The difference between taekwondo and karate is that taekwondo emphasizes the use of the feet while karate, the use of the hands. Participants wear only Knuckle protectors and punches are pulled short of contact.

Aside from these sports activities, starting individuals are taught the value of respect and humility. As he progresses he learns to be patient and when he reaches the coveted black belt he learns the value of his perseverance.

To the martial artist, his art is more than just punches and kicks. It is a way of life.
